Loch Ness is a thornless, high yielding blackberry with a large fruit size and good shelf life.

Breeder: SCRI

Parentage: 74126R/A8 x 75131D2.

Season: In Scotland, picking begins around mid-August, 10-14 days later than Loch Tay.

Fruit Quality: Loch Ness has large fruit, 5g and is firm, glossy black in colour, has an excellent flavour when ripe and excellent storage capabilities.

Disease resistance: Good tolerance to purple blotch and botrytis but can be susceptible to downy mildew.

Field characteristics: Loch Ness is thorn-free with semi-erect canes that are well presented and easy to manage.
